U.S. Troop Use Ban Is Proposed

WASHINGTON — (P) — Rep. Frederic R. Coudert Jr. (R-N. Y.) asked congress today to outlaw shipment of U. S. troops to Indochina except with congressional assent.

Coudert proposed to write the ban into a \$28,680,706,500 appropriation for the administration's "new look" defense program which the house called up for debate today.

Administration leaders figured they could beat the Coudert amendment. However, they were not too happy about the debate

Rebels May Starve Out Dien Bien Phu

HANOI, Indochina — (P) — Viet Minh rebels confined their assaults on battered Dien Bien Phu to artillery barrages again today amid mounting indications they may hold off further frontal assaults in hopes of starving out the weary French Union defenders.

During the night of the 27th, the rebels fired the narrow front assault which they said was the most serious yet.

The Viet Minh rebels captured the town of Kham Khua in northern Laos, 100 miles north of Dien Bien Phu, the royal capital, situated on the Nam Hou river.
